The AISRF is Australia's largest bilateral science program with any country (\$64 million) and one of India's biggest sources of support for international science collaboration.

The AISRF supports collaborative projects and workshops in priority areas agreed by the two governments, as well as fellowship programs.

Since its inception, the program has brought together more than 90 top universities and research institutions on both sides and hundreds of researchers to help tackle the grand challenges of today, including in food and water security, environment, health and energy.

Looking ahead

India's 12th Five Year Plan for 2012-171

Priorities for the Indian Government over the next five years include:

Education and skills

- Focus on expansion, quality and equity
- Improved learning outcomes through job-relevant education
- Building research capability in universities
- Raising teacher training standards
- Increasing workforce with formal VET skills from 10% to 25% by 2017
- VET in schools and new community colleges
- A National Skill Qualifications Framework with standards developed by Sector Skill Councils
- Improved quality and quantity of trainers (training of trainers)
- Promoting Public Private Partnerships (PPPs)
- Development of a higher education internationalisation strategy to encourage joint research, mobility (faculty and students), credit transfer and qualifications recognition arrangements, and online learning delivery to overcome acute faculty shortages.

Science

- New Science, Technology and Innovation Policy 2013 aims to position India among top 5 global scientific powers by 2020
- Focus on attracting students to science, stimulating research in universities, and expanding number of research institutions and international collaborations
- Increase gross expenditure on R&D to 2 per cent of GDP, by encouraging private sector investment from 0.2% to 1% of GDP.

Legislation

- Nine education related Bills currently pending Parliamentary approval, including The Foreign Educational Institutions (Regulation of Entry and Operations) Bill, 2010
- University Grants Commission proposal to limit twinning arrangements to only Top 500
 Times/Shanghai Jiao Tong foreign institutions not currently being pursued.

- Annual Australia-India Ministerial Dialogue on Education Cooperation Australia, first half 2013
- 2nd Australia India Education Council (AIEC) meeting Australia, first half 2013
- Australia-India Joint Working Group on education and training cooperation Australia
