
International student data summary

## **End of Year Summary of International Student Data 2019**

In 2019, there were 956,773 enrolments generated by 758,154 full-fee paying international students in Australia on a student visa. This represents a 9.7% increase in enrolments on 2018 compared with an average annual enrolments growth rate of 10.3% per year over the preceding five years. Commencements increased by 7.6% on 2018. This compares with the average annual commencements growth rate of 7.9% per year over the preceding five years.

## Sector

The largest volume of enrolments and commencements in 2019 were in higher education (46.2% & 34.7% respectively) followed by VET (29.7% & 33.2%), ELICOS (16.4% & 22.8%) and the non-award sector (5.0% & 6.9%). Postgraduate research commencements increased by 2.4%, while other postgraduate commencements grew by 8.7% on 2018 figures. Bachelor degree commencements grew by 9.1% over the same period.



In the higher education sector, the top two source countries were China (37.3% of enrolments) and India (20.5%). In the VET sector India contributed the largest share of enrolments

(15.9%) followed by Nepal (10.3%) China (8.5%) and Brazil (7.8%).

In the ELICOS sector, China was the largest source of enrolments (26.9%). Colombia was the next largest nationality (11.3% of enrolments), followed by Brazil (10.5%) and Thailand (5.8%). In schools, China was the largest source of enrolments (47.0%), followed by Vietnam (16.6%) and South Korea (5.3%).

In the non-award sector, more than a third (37.5%) of enrolments were students from China. The USA and the UK were a further 14.1% and 4.0% respectively.

Enrolments from China and the UK saw a drop of 6.9% and 7.3% respectively. Enrolments from the USA were up by 5.3 %.
