
Export income to Australia from international education activity in 2016-17

This snapshot highlights the latest data on international education exports released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics in its *International Trade in Services* series^(a).

Size of exports

International education activity^(b) arising from international students studying and living in Australia contributed \$28.0 billion to the economy in 2016-17. This is a 16.1% increase from the earnings recorded in financial year 2015-16 (\$24.1 billion^(c)).

The *total* export income generated by all international education activity was \$28.6 billion. This comprised spending by onshore students (the ABS uses the term *education-related personal travel* for this item), as well as offshore earnings from other educational services and royalties which generated an additional \$521 million, as outlined in the table below.




Australia's total exports of education-related services

Education-related personal travel is Australia's 3rd largest export after iron ore (\$62.8 billion) and coal (\$54.3 billion). It is the largest *services* export (34.3% of total services exports), ahead of *other personal travel services* (\$21.6 billion); and *professional and management consulting services* (\$4.8 billion).

Education sector^(d)

In 2016-17, the higher education sector generated \$19.1 billion in export income (68.1% of total on-shore earnings). The VET sector generated \$4.8 billion in earnings (17.3% of total), ELICOS was \$1.4 billion (5.2%); schools was \$1.2 billion (4.4%); and non-award was \$981 million (3.5%).
